Celebrations

Celebrations are fun and exciting! Formal celebrations, like birthday parties and holidays, can be both joyous and over-stimulating for babies and toddlers. Recognize your baby's need for a quiet break from the excitement. For very young children, every day provides opportunities to explore and celebrate their world.



- Playing dress up with your baby can be a fun way to celebrate. Many families dress up for special occasions. As you dress for a holiday or other celebration, talk to your child about what you are wearing and why you are dressed up! Help them choose their own special outfit.
- Talk about different things you can celebrate. Show your child pictures of special past celebrations in your own family and talk about what is happening in the pictures.
- Draw a celebration card together with your child. You can put this card up in your home or mail it to a family member or friend.
- During the year, the library celebrates reading through many fun events including storytimes and the Summer Reading Program.
